We ask you this summer to reflect upon reading and math and how it plays an important part in your child's life.

What kind of attitude do you have toward reading and math? Do you believe that these skills are important job and life skills? Do you see these as useful in everyday life? Or do you dread doing things that involve reading and math? Balancing the checkbook, reading the technical manual that came with the DVD player? How you answer these questions indicates how you may be influencing your child's attitudes toward reading and math — and how he/she approaches learning them.

June is finally here and with the warm weather and summer approaching, help your children choose a goal, such as reading five “fat” books over the summer. One way to help them do this is to take them to the library to select and borrow books.



Draw a goal chart in the form of a thermometer. Help your child track his/her progress by filling the “mercury” of the thermometer as he/she takes steps towards reaching his goal, with points marking “Hot!”, “Hotter!” and “Hottest!!!.”

Choose a proper reward (a special dinner of their choice, a toy they always wanted, etc...) and give it to your child when the mercury reaches the “Hottest!!!” section of the thermometer.
